POSTS, TELEPHONES, TELEGRAPHS AND RADIO

ARTICLE I

**Public Means of Communication**

1. Until further order of Military Government, all telephone, teletype, telegraph and radio services (inland, foreign and transit) and all internal, external, and transit mail services are suspended. Radio broadcasting transmissions by wireless or wire are excepted and are "subject to separate regulations.

2. All items in course of transmission by post wheter internal, external or transit shall be detained by the postal authorities and safeguarded pending further instructions from Military Government.

3. Nothing in this article shall prohibit the continuance, subject to other instructions of Military Government, of savings bank and other post office financial services not involving the use of any suspended service.

4. All officials and employees of the Reichspost (except such as may be suspended by order of Military Government) and all persons employed on other telecommunication systems shall continue to report to their normal places of duty until otherwise authorised by Military Government. They will be responsible for the preservation, maintenance and repair of all communication facilities, stores and supplies, so far as consistent with paragraph 1 of this Law, for the preservation of all message fills, records books of account and documents relating thereto, for supplying detailed information of all telegraph, teletype and telephone circuits (both radio and line) With particulars of associated equipment, and for the protection of all such facilities, stores, supplies and records against sabotage, damage or removal, except as ordered by Military Government.
