

ARTICLE II

Private Means of Communication

5. All radio transmission sets and parts and accessories thereof shall be surrendered against receipt and all carrier pigeons shall be surrendered against receipt or declared in accordance with notices published by Military Government in each locality.

6. All persons having in their possession any articles or equipment falling into any of the categories listed below and not forming a part of a publicly owned communication system shall declare the same in accordance with notices published by the Military Government in each locality:

- (a) Telephone or telegraph equipment, including lines (other than power transmission lines), microphones, public address systems.
- (b) Electrical testing and for measuring apparatus or equipment (exclusive of voltmeters, ammeters or other single purpose meters).
- (c) Valves (other than rectifier valves) with an anode dissipation greater than 10 Watts.
- (d) Any equipment or apparatus which specifically generates high frequency current, at a frequency greater than 10,000 cycles per second (other than, superheterodyne radio receivers) for use either within the equipment, or apparatus or for external use or application.
- (e) Any radio receiver which incorporates a beat frequency oscillator or any other device specifically included for the reception of continuous wave signals.
- (f) Any radio receiver specifically designed for purposes other than the reception of commercial or governmental broadcast transmissions, i. e., any communication receiver (Verkehrsempfänger).
- (g) All items pertaining to the Drahtfunk system of communication.

7. All persons having in their possession any other apparatus or equipment relating to communications which Military Government shall from time to time require by notices or other appropriate action to be surrendered or declared shall surrender or declare such apparatus or equipment as directed by such requirement.
