- 30. The sender's identity must be established at the time of filing a message, by exhibition of Mentification card in the case of individuals or, in the case of others, by such means as may be determined by Censorship.
- 31. Verbatim confirmations of postal, cable, radio, telegraph or telephone communications, except confirmations of money transfers, are prohibited.

Section IV — Telephone regulations

- 32. In addition to the General Regulations the following regulations apply in particular to all telephone calls. They do not, however, apply to official government and press communication#
- 33. Conversations must be readily understandable. Code may not be used. Censorship may refuse to permit a call in a language other than German, English or French.
- 34. Information required. When making application for any external call the following information must be submitted:
 - a) The full name (first and family names) and nationality of the calling and called parties and of any other persons who will participate in the conversation.
 - b) The number and date of issue of the identification card of the party or parties located in Germany.
 - c) The occupation and, where applicable, the business connection of each person participating in the conversation.
 - d) The permanent business address of all parties. If a party has no business address, the address of his permanent residence will * be given.
 - e) The listing (including full name and address) of the telephones located in Germany to bemused on the call.
 - f) The proposed topic of conversation, i. e., whether business or social — if business, the exact subject must be given, such as oil, coffee, etc.
 - g) The language to be "spoken.
 - h) Additional information may be required at the discretion of : Censorship.
- 35. External calls must be made by application to the operator, rather than bj^ means of automatic or dialing devices. 36
- 36. No external calls may be made from unattended public telephones. Parties speaking from hotels, hospitals Or similar places, must be properly identified by the management or other acceptable authority.
