

- (e) Processing or printing of motion picture film obtained from licensed film producers.
- (f) Distributing, selling or lending commercially sound recordings.

4. No person" shall conduct any activity listed in Section 3 of this Regulation except under the following conditions:

- (a) He shall first have registered at the office of the Military Government in such form and under such conditions as may be prescribed.
- (b) He shall adhere strictly to all Regulations and Instructions issued.
- (c) The producers and publishers concerned are duly licensed or, in the case of publications and sound recordings produced prior to the promulgation of this Regulation, such material does not fall within any category the preparation, distribution or sale of which is prohibited by Military Government Regulation or Instruction.

5. Music may be presented without licensing or without registration where it is incidental to religious service. Instrumental music may be presented without licensing or without registration when it is incidental to an activity clearly nonmusical in character, such as the sale of food or beverages in restaurants, cafes and inns, or the presentation of spoken drama by a theatrical producer who has been duly licensed by Military Government, provided that all such music is in keeping with Military Government Regulations and Instructions.

6. For the purpose of this Regulation the term "person" shall mean any natural person or collective persons and any juristic person under public or private law and any government, including all political subdivisions, public corporations, agencies, and instrumentalities thereof.

7. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Regulation shall, upon conviction by Military Government Court, be liable to any lawful punishment the court may determine.

8. This regulation shall become effective upon the date of its first promulgation.
