## 7. Music

No music will be permitted which propagates militaristic ideas or which is associated with the NSDAP, Fascism, Pan-Germanism or the German Army or, in the case of incidental vocal music, whose words conflict with para. 1 of this Instruction.

## Information Control Instruction No. 2

## USE OF INFORMATION MEDIA BY AUTHORIZED GERMAN POLITICAL PARTIES

- 1. Every authorized German political party is hereby granted a license to publish handbills and posters for distribution in its areas of activity, provided that the following conditions are fulfilled:
  - (a) Printing will be done by a registerd printer, and if a commercial distributor is employed, he will be likewise duly registered.
  - (b) Prior to distribution three copies of each such publication will be filed with the local Military government Detachement with wdiich the party in questions has been registered.
  - (c) Handbills published by any one political party will not total more than one handbill for every ten persons in the authorized area in any one month. Handbills will not be larger than 15,25 by 21,5 centimeters. Posters published by any one political party will not total more than one for every hundred persons in the area in any one month. Posters will not be larger than 61 by 43 centimeters and may be affixed only in such places as have been duly for posting. \*
  - (Φ Handbills and posters published by political parties in accordance with this directive may include only the following material:
    - 1. Names and places of political meetings. 2. Namqs of speakers and party officials. 3. Officially adopted party platforms, proclamatiins, slogans and programs or portions thereof. 4. Exhortations to attend a meeting or to support the party concerned.
