. CURFEW

- 1. Article II, Par. 22 of Ordinance No. *1 is amended to read as follows:
 - "22, Circulating without a permit during curfew as established, or as authorized, by Military Government;"
- 2. All curfew regulations imposed on the civilian population, whether by Military Government or the German authorities, prior to the effective date of this Ordinance are hereby terminated.
 - 3. This Ordinance becomes effective 30 March 1946.

Ordinance No. 6

MILITARY GOVERNMENT COURT FOR CIVIL ACTIONS

- 1. There is hereby established a court designated "Military Government Court for Civil Actions".
- 2. The court shall ultimately be composed of three members or judges, each shall be a member of the bar in good ständig in one of the States or Territories or the District of Columbia of the United States, well grounded in the law and of outstanding integrity and ability. Members of the court shall be appointed by the Deputy Military Governor for Germany for a term of not less than one year.'
- 3. The official seat or headquarters of the court shall be at Stuttgart, "but the court may sit at such times and places within the United States Zone, the United States Sector of Berlin or Bremen Enclave at it may determine
