MILITARY GOVERNMENT UNITED STATES ZONE

Amendment No. 1 to Military Government Law No. 2

- 1. Military Government Law Number 2, German Courts, Article VI, paragraph 10^ prohibits German courts from asserting or exercising jurisdiction in cases against any national of the United Nations and cases involving the construction or validity of any order or enactment of Military Government.
- 2. In Order to prohibit an action under Control Council Law No. 16 (Law Marriage) by a United Nations national which cannot be opposed by a counter action, and in order to allow German courts to handle such cases arising under and involving interpretations of such law:
 - (a) German courts may not accept jurisdiction of cases under Control Council Law No. 16 in which a United Nations national is a party; and
 - (b) German courts are expressly authorized to assert and exercise jurisdiction in cases involving the construction and interpretation of the provisions of Control Council Law No. 16 when such cases are properly before them.

Note: This amendment was originally promulgated 2 March 1946 Mid became effective on that date.
