

Zone in question. The authorised representatives of Governments of any of the United Nations may file similar requests under the same procedure, which will be subject to the approval of the respective Zone Commanders.

ARTICLE II

Any officer or any representative of Military Government who has been charged with the operation or control of a public office, of a private enterprise, or of any other German organisation is, legally, the custodian of any documents appertaining to that organisation. In the event that no custodian has been designated with respect to any document requested in accordance with Article I, then, upon receipt of such request and representation, the occupying authority of the area within which the requested document is located shall designate an officer or representative who shall, for the purpose hereinafter referred to, take into his temporary custody the document so requested. # u

ARTICLE III

The legal custodian, as provided by Article II, shall furnish a copy of the requested document with a certificate endorsed on the said copy in the form set out in Appendix A hereof, and shall transmit the said copy to the representative of the interested Government through the medium of the Allied Liaison and Protocol Section of the Allied Control Authority, with, if necessary, an account of the expenses incurred in making the requested copy. After having complied with such request, the document shall be returned to the files of the enterprise or German Government body entitled to it.

ARTICLE IV

Control Council Law No. 6 dated 10th November 1945 is hereby repealed and this Law shall come into force on the date of publication.
